

Hands-On Training Course on Surgical Anatomy of the Neck, Larynx and Parotid Gland

Barcelona (Bellaterra), 8-10 February 2017

This practical course wants to review the surgical anatomy of the neck, the larynx and the parotid gland through individual dissection work on cadaver. It is the result of a close collaboration between the Otorhinolaryngology-H&N Department of the Hospital de Sant Pau and the Human Anatomy Department at UAB and has been supported by the Confederation of European Otorhinolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery. We want to stress that every participant will do a complete anatomical dissection on a cadaver with the objective of acquiring a better knowledge of the surgical anatomy and this practical work will be done following a strict guideline with clear objectives.

Wednesday, February 8:

- Superficial layer of the neck: skin, platysma.
- Superficial fascia and submandibular area (level I).

14:30–19:00 Afternoon sessions:

- Special lecture: Selective neck dissections.
- Surgical anatomy of the levels II, III and IV.
- Surgical anatomy of the level V.

Thursday, February 9:

09:00–13:30 Morning sessions:

- Anterior neck: Strap muscles.
- Superior Thyroid gland and laryngeal nerves.

14:30–19:00 Afternoon sessions:

- Special lecture: Framework laryngeal surgery.
- Surgical anatomy of the larynx.

Friday, February 10:

09:00–13:30 Morning sessions:

- Superficial anatomy of the parotid area
- Facial nerve in the parotid gland. Lateral parotidectomy.

14:30–19:00 Afternoon sessions:

- Special lecture: Controversies in parotid surgery.
- Total parotidectomy.
- External carotid artery.
- Final remarks.
